SCRABBLE COMPETITION

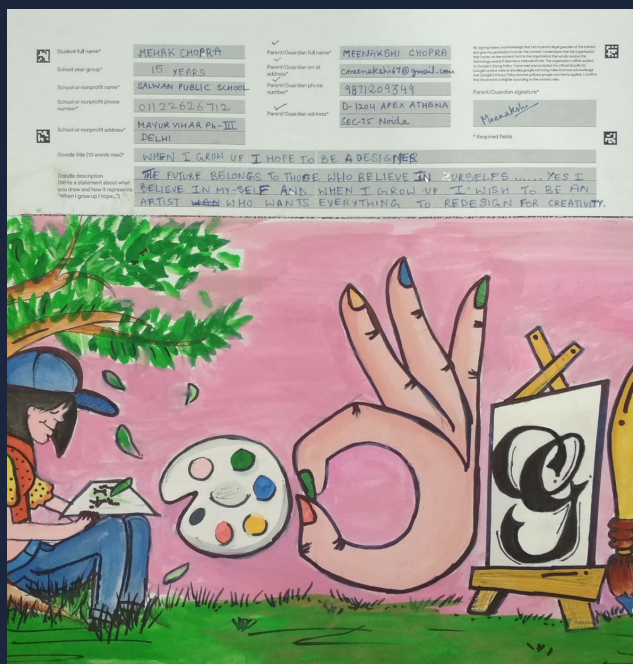
SEPTEMBER 28, 2019

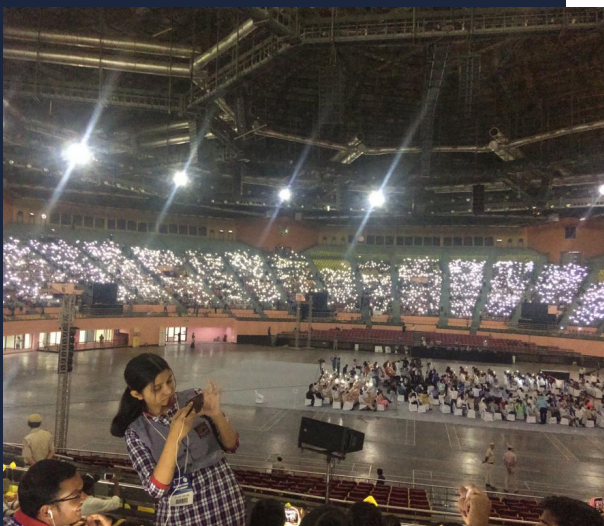

SOLAR ENERGY- DOESN'T COST THE EARTH.

OCTOBER 02, 2019



It needs no elaboration that the world is today at the crossroads due to contradictory energy scenario wherein billions of people are without energy access in some parts of the world, while some are over-exploiting the energy resources particularly fossil fuels. In order to change this scenario IIT Bombay along with MNRE organized a historical event 'Energy Swaraj' based on the Gandhian principle of 'Gram Swaraj', where complete self-reliance was the guiding mantra. The event was held at IGI stadium, on 2nd October, wherein fifty students along with five teachers from the Science Department participated in this Global Solar Assemblage event. Solar lamps were assembled by students under the guidance of teachers. Two Guinness World Records for the following titles were set:-

1. A Historical Attempt by students in India on 2nd October, 2019 to create a record where maximum number of . Most People Assembled Solar Powered Lamps simultaneously.

2. Broke the record of the largest environmental sustainability lesson attended by 2,289 participants, achieved by Larsen & Toubro, Water and Effluent Treatment IC (India) at Chennai, India, on 16 March 2018. The new record set was at 4780 participants. The programme culminated with a pledge of non-violence and lighting of all the solar lamps.

VISIT TO CSIR-NPL

SEPTEMBER 30, 2019

The Council of Scientific & Industrial Research (CSIR), celebrated its foundation day on 30th September 2019. On this occasion, CSIR-NPL opened its doors for school and college students to explore the state of art experimental facilities of the laboratory and various research fields.

30 students got an opportunity to visit CSIR-NPL on its foundation day. It was an eye opener to them. They got a chance to see several methods to separate air pollutants in atmosphere in Radio and Atmospheric Sciences and were also amazed to see new method of collection of representative air samples. They also got a chance to practically see the devices such as rotary pump etc. to measure pressure from Giga Pascal to micro pascal and got to know how the machines are calibrated to measure blood pressure. It was followed by pump probe spectroscopy, He/⁴He dilution refrigerator and few more devices which enriched the overall learning experience of everyone.
